### Word from the Pastor

The Japanese have a saying "Kodomo No Tame Ni" which means "for the sake of the children." It was a saying I have long known but one that was refreshed in my memory at our beloved Rose Honda's memorial service who spent her lifetime dedicated to the field of childhood education.

I know "Kodomo No Tame Ni" is not a wisdom saying exclusive to Japanese culture or its people. Many cultures embrace a desire to be and act in ways that benefit one's own children or future generations as a whole.

With the joyous birth of our granddaughter Rooney Sueko Boyd (our very first grandchild) born on April 2 to our daughter Alison and son-in-law Joe, I find myself even more concerned about what kind of future awaits her generation. Though I have always felt a deep concern for humanity and the kind of world that awaits future generations long after my life passes from this earthly existence, the birth of our granddaughter makes this concern all the more personal and real to me. I don't want to be pessimistic about the future. I want to be optimistic and hopeful. I want to find reassurance that there is promise and blessing that awaits my granddaughter and all of humanity long after I am gone. And I know that part of that hope lies in me and each of us.

As a pastor I feel I must be attentive to what is currently going on in our nation

and world. I believe it is antithetical to the mission and purpose of Christ's church to simply bury our heads in the sand and pretend the troubles of the world will go away or are no concern to us.

Certainly, we may, at times, feel the need to momentarily disengage from the troubling news that bombards us daily out of concern for our own emotional, physical, and spiritual well-being by being attentive to the needs of self-care, recreation, and other matters that promote wellness; but I am convinced that God calls me and all of us to consider what we can do to help a broken world "kodomo no tame ni" (for the sake of the children/future generations).

I am reminded that John Wesley, the founder of Methodism, once said, "The world is my parish" which I understand to mean that entire world is our concern. Our faith and spiritual lives are not lived solely unto ourselves but in deep connection with all of humanity and creation. Our faith must be lived out and expressed in response to the world not with hate and contempt, or fear and apprehension but with grace and compassion and a deep desire to contribute to the well-being and healing of the world.

The season of Pentecost follows Eastertide! The coming church season is a remembrance of how the Holy Spirit infused a passion in the followers of Christ to carry on the hope of Christ by sharing the love of God as was modeled in his life.

Church can feel like a respite and sanctuary (a shelter) from the troubles of the world and we should be thankful that it is truly that very experience for any and all of us. But Christ's church was also to be about a people infused with a purpose and mission to heal the brokenness of the world and carry God's love out to those in need and those circumstances of the world where hope is desperately needed.

Friends, there are many opportunities for

you to engage in the good work of Christ's church that Jesus the Christ left in the care and direction of all who would follow from generation to generation. For the sake of the children... let us do what we can to mend the brokenness of the world in whatever small or big way we can and leave future generations with a world that indeed is promising and hopeful!

### VBS is Coming!


Get Ready to Dive into a Relationship with God at SCUBA VBS!

### LOCAL SPOTLIGHT: THE BALLONA WETLANDS JAMIE THIERMAN

As I mentioned last month, supporting the environment at our own local level is one of the most important things we can do for the world's ecosystems. This month I would like to spotlight the Ballona Wetlands.

Honestly, it was Ms. Frizzle from the Magic School Bus who first taught me how important wetlands are. As her little cartoon class defended their local wetlands from an impending mall, I learned that millions of plants and animals depend upon this habitat for survival, and that wetlands serve people and cities as well, acting as essential flood control, and water and air purification.

I didn't even realize that Los Angeles had wetlands until I happened to see it once on Google Maps, near Playa Vista. I was officially introduced to the Ballona Wetlands via Steve Hirai, who is on the board of directors of Friends of Ballona Wetlands, a group that has been fighting to protect and restore the area since 1978. I learned that the Ballona Wetlands are a tiny fraction of wetlands that once covered the California coast, of which approximately 90% have been destroyed. I heard their inspiring story of struggle and perseverance as they continue the restoration.

So please join us as West LA United Methodist Church goes to discover this amazing reserve for their Migration Celebration on May 18th! There will be bird demonstrations, music, food trucks, marionette performances, arts and crafts and more, including freshwater marsh tours throughout the day. The event is free and runs from 10am-2pm. (We'll be aiming to meet around 10:30 if you want to join some WLAUMC friends).
