# IN-PERSON CHARGE CONFERENCE: DECEMBER 13TH AT 3PM

In the Learning Center

## To all chairpersons of committees and leaders of ministries,

We have set our CHARGE CONFERENCE for Saturday December 13th at 3pm but have relocated our gathering to the Learning Center as our Nisei Fellowship Hall will be set up for the Sunday's Creche Walk.

We thank all chairs of committees and leaders of ministries, and church staff who have submitted reports and trust that you will be in attendance as we gather in-person with our District Superintendent Rev. Siosaia Tu'itahi who will preside over our Charge Conference as prescribed by our UM Book of Discipline.

At Charge Conference we approve the appointed clergy pastoral compensation packages; approve our budget and slate of officers, leaders, and committee and ministry members; share and compile ministry and committee reports in the form of a journal for everyone to review and celebrate our ministry of this past year and our hopes and vision for the coming year; and hear the news and concerns of our District and Conference through our District Superintendent!

## **NOURISHING OUR NEIGHBORS IN WEST LA**

West LA UMC continues its collaboration with the West LA Community Coalition (WLACC), Westside Food Bank (WFB), and the 580 Café/Wesley Foundation Serving UCLA in providing boxes of fresh fruit and vegetables to students in need each week. Since this Church's project began in August through October, we have served 527 families and 662 children connected through the 580 Café community (we average 176 families per month and 221 children). Of the students served, 59% are BIPOC, 68% graduate students, 16% professional students, 15% undergraduate students, and 77% are students with dependent children. A few more boxes are set aside for Nichigo families and go to the 580 Café as ingredients in student lunches and snacks.

Although Deaconess Jeri remains the liaison with the WLACC, WFB, and Deaconess Jeanne Roe Smith at the 580, the program is now primarily one of mutual aid, of students helping students by arranging the pick-ups and deliveries, assuring equitable distribution among many students, and keeping the statistics for us.

With grateful hearts, on Sunday, November 2, Team WLAUMC participated in the Westside Food Bank's 35th Annual 5k Hunger Walk along the beach in Santa Monica. Our team raised \$1,675 from the WLA and Culver-Palms congregations, 580 Café Board members, and friends – a small contribution compared with the abundance we receive.

The needs of the food insecure among us are only increasing during the holidays and with the federal government shutdown, job furloughs without pay, elimination of SNAP (Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program) benefits and other hardships. The WFB is always in need of volunteers, especially on the last Friday of the month. Contact Deaconess Jeri at jotwlaumc@gmail.com for more information about volunteering.

Deaconess Jeanne Roe Smith and the student community give thanks to WLAUMC for its ongoing and generous financial and in-kind support of donated food pantry items and grocery gift cards, and coordinating produce boxes from the Westside Food Bank. There has been an estimated 50% increase in students coming to the food pantry this quarter, requiring constant restocking (see list for needs).

This fall, the 580 Café community also mourns the passing of two legendary supporters of this campus ministry and its constituents at the margins – Prof. Kent Wong, former director of the UCLA Labor Center, and Carla Bailey, long-time board member and supporter, and wife of West LA UMC's Bob Bailey. They modeled leadership, activism, and compassion and leave a legacy of hope and inclusive justice for all.



## CAFE ALOHA REPORT & MEMBER CARE

This ministry is a dedicated outreach program that serves older adults aged 70 and above within our church community. Rooted in compassion and respect, our mission is to affirm the inherent dignity of our elders by providing regular care, meaningful connections, and a reminder that they are loved – both by God and their church family.

Eachmonth, we provide a free, nutritious, home-cooked Japanese meal to our Issei, Nisei, Sansei members and their caregivers. Meals are delivered directly to recipients' homes throughout the year. We provide health-related articles in both Japanese and English, brain-stimulating activities, and a spiritual message that reminds them of God's love and faithfulness. In addition, we host three "in-person" luncheons in our church fellowship hall to encourage social interaction, provide a spiritual message, and reduce isolation. These meals are prepared with attention to cultural preferences and dietary needs, fostering both physical and emotional well-being. Our program addresses the growing needs of an aging population, particularly among Asian older adults who may be experiencing increasing social isolation or health challenges.

Beyond meals, we provide ongoing emotional and spiritual support via mailings of various cards to those who are facing physical challenges, hospitalized, celebrating birthdays, mourning the loss of a loved one, to those experiencing social isolation, Easter and Christmas.
